Fried rice (chao fan): a simple and versatile dish made with cooked rice and a variety of ingredients such as vegetables and proteins. Kids can help measure out the ingredients and stir-fry them in a pan.

- Celebrating traditional holidays such as Chinese New Year and the Mid-Autumn Festival
- Reading traditional Chinese stories and fables, such as "The Jade Emperor's Race" and "The Great Race"
- Making traditional Chinese crafts and artwork, such as paper lanterns and clay dolls

LANGUAGE OF THE MONTH

Italian is a Romance language developed in Italy during the 13th century. It is the official language of Italy, Switzerland, San Marino, and Vatican City. Italian developed from a combination of Latin, Greek, and local dialects and was heavily influenced by the Tuscan dialect spoken in Florence. Italian became the official language of Italy in the 19th century after the unification.

Tamil is the official language of the Indian state of Tamil Nadu and is also spoken by Tamil communities in other parts of India, Sri Lanka, and Southeast Asia. Tamil has a rich literary tradition and has influenced the development of other Dravidian languages.

LANGUAGE OF THE MONTH

HUNGARIAN

Hungarian is a Uralic language spoken primarily in Hungary. It is known for its complex grammar and unique sound system. Chicken paprikash: a hearty stew made with chicken, onions, and paprika. Kids can help measure out the ingredients and stir the stew as it cooks.

- Celebrating traditional Hungarian holidays such as St. Stephen's Day and Easter
- Listening to and singing traditional Hungarian folk songs and nursery rhymes
- Making traditional Hungarian crafts and artwork, such as embroidery and lace-making
- Participating in traditional Hungarian sports and games, such as csuka and üstökös

LANGUAGE OF THE MONTH

GERMAN

German is a member of the Indo-European language family and is the official language of Germany, Austria, Belgium, and Luxembourg. German developed from the language spoken by the Germanic tribes who migrated to central Europe in the 1st century AD. It has had a significant influence on the development of other Germanic languages and is the most widely spoken mother tongue in the European Union.

Schnitzel: a thin cut of meat (such as pork or chicken) coated in breadcrumbs and fried until crispy. Kids can help bread the meat by dipping it in flour, eggs, and breadcrumbs.

- Celebrating traditional German holidays such as Oktoberfest and Christmas
- Listening to and singing traditional German folk songs and nursery rhymes
- Making traditional German crafts and artwork, such as wooden toys and stained glass
- Participating in traditional German sports and games, such as soccer and bocce ball

NOONGAR

Noongar is an Indigenous Australian language spoken in the southwestern region of Western Australia. It is a member of the Pama-Nyungan language family and is spoken by fewer than 1,000 people. Noongar is one of the many Indigenous languages of Australia, and its use has been revitalized in recent years. Noongar has a rich oral tradition and has influenced the development of other Indigenous languages in Australia.

Damper: a type of bread made with flour and water, often cooked over an open fire. Kids can help mix the dough and shape it into a round loaf.

- Participating in traditional Noongar cultural activities such as storytelling, dance, and music
- Eating traditional Noongar food and participating in traditional Noongar ceremonies and rituals
- Visiting Noongar cultural centers and landmarks, such as the Ngaraadjin Boodja (Noongar Cultural Centre) in Perth

Over 260 million people in Indonesia and other parts of Southeast Asia speak Bahasa Indonesia, which is based on the Malay language and got influenced by Dutch, Arabic, and Chinese.

PORTUGUESE

Portuguese is a member of the Indo-European language family. Portuguese developed from the Latin spoken by the Romans in the western part of the Iberian Peninsula. It was heavily influenced by the Germanic languages of the Visigoths, who invaded the region in the 5th century. Portuguese became the official language of Portugal in the 15th century and spread to other parts of the world through the Portuguese empire.

TRADITIONAL FOOD

Pastel de nata: a delicious custard tart made with puff pastry and a creamy egg custard filling. Kids can help roll out the pastry and fill the tart shells.

- Celebrating traditional Portuguese holidays such as Festa de São João, or traditional Brazilian holidays such as Dia de São João
- Making traditional crafts and artwork, such as azulejos and cordel literature from Portugal, and samba drums and carnival masks from Brazil
- Participating in traditional sports and games, such as soccer and bullfighting from Portugal, and soccer and capoeira from Brazil

LANGUAGE OF THE MONTH

SPANISH

Spanish is spoken primarily in Spain and Latin America. It has roots in the Vulgar Latin spoken by the Romans and was heavily influenced by the Arabic language, which was spoken in Spain during the period of Muslim rule. Spanish has a rich literary tradition and is the second most spoken language in terms of native speakers and the third most spoken language overall in the world.

INTERESTING FACTS

In Spanish, exclamation and question marks are placed upside down to emphasize the exclamatory or interrogative nature of a sentence. E.g.: ¿Jose, adónde vas? - Jose, where are you going?

TRADITIONAL FOOD

Tortilla de patatas: a classic Spanish omelette made with potatoes and onions. Kids can help slice the potatoes and onions and mix the ingredients together.

- Celebrating traditional holidays such as Semana Santa and Latin American holidays such as Day of the Dead.
- Reading traditional stories and fables, such as "Don Quixote" from Spain, and "The Popol Vuh" and "El Cid" from Latin America
- Making traditional crafts and artwork, such as flamenco dancing from Spain, and quilting and pottery from Latin America

LANGUAGE OF THE MONTH

HINDI

Hindi is an Indo-Aryan language spoken primarily in India. It has a long literary tradition and is the official language of India. Hindi developed from the Sanskrit language and was heavily influenced by the regional dialects of northern India. Hindi is written in the Devanagari script and is one of the two official languages of India, along with English.

INTERESTING FACTS

In Hindi, every letter has a unique, standalone sound. Therefore, Hindi words are pronounced exactly as they are written, making the language simple to learn.

TRADITIONAL FOOD

Samosas: a popular snack made with a spiced filling (such as potatoes or lentils) wrapped in a flaky pastry dough. Kids can help fill and fold the pastry dough into a triangular shape.

- Celebrating traditional Hindi holidays such as Diwali and Holi
- Listening to and singing traditional Hindi folk songs and nursery rhymes
- Reading traditional Hindi stories and fables, such as "The Ramayana" and "The Mahabharata"
- Making traditional Hindi crafts and artwork, such as rangoli and mehndi
- Participating in traditional Hindi sports and games, such as kabbadi and kho kho

Falafel: a popular snack made with ground chickpeas or fava beans shaped into balls and deep-fried. Kids can help shape the falafel mixture into balls and place them in the fryer.

- Celebrating traditional holidays such as Eid al-Fitr and Eid al-Adha
- Listening to and singing traditional Arabic folk songs and nursery rhymes
- Reading traditional Arabic stories and fables such as Ameen and the Ghool or The Arabian Nights
- Making traditional Arabic crafts and artwork, such as calligraphy and mosaic
